

Noto Peninsula Earthquake Support Information

The available support systems differ depending on the application of the Disaster Relief Law to your area, and other conditions.

Once you receive a **Disaster Victim Certificate**, please check which support systems are available to you based on the certificate, and then consider how to approach rebuilding your home. Possibilities include repair, reconstruction, rebuilding in a different place, and living in a rental property or temporary housing.


Flow of reconstruction for people whose home is at least half destroyed (example)

*For Support Grants for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims, single person households are eligible for three-fourths of the amounts below.

- Available free of charge for two years (general rule)
- Confirm conditions for moving in with your local government
- Period of tenancy may be extended beyond two years in some cases

The Japan Housing Finance Agency (JHF) offers a special loan program for those aged 60 or above (under which only interest is to be repaid)

Special allowance for residents of six cities/towns in Noto Official name: Regional Temporary Welfare Special Allowance Tel. 076-225-1956

Eligible households: Those (1) which live in Suzu, Wajima, Anamizu, Noto, Nanao, or Shiga, (2) home of which is half destroyed or worse, or (3) which include an elderly person or a person with disabilities, or which are expected not to be able to borrow and pay back funds easily, meaning households which (a) are exempt from resident tax or subject to the per-capita portion only, (b) have had sudden changes in their financial situation, (c) receive a child dependent allowance, (d) include a person who is unemployed or has shut down their business, or (e) have a certain amount of outstanding loans.

Allowance for household goods	500,000yen (no need to actually purchase household goods)
Allowance for purchasing cars	500,000yen (no need to actually purchase a car, but old car must be scrapped)
Allowance for reconstructing livelihoods (full amount also paid for single person households)	Up to 2 million yen in support for construction, purchase, or repair Up to 1 million yen in support for rental housing
