The available support systems differ depending on the application of the Disaster Relief Law to your area, and other conditions.

Once you receive a Disaster Victim Certificate, please check which support systems are available to you based on the certificate, and then consider how to approach rebuilding your home. Possibilities include repair, reconstruction, rebuilding in Check here if you want to know a different place, and living in a rental property or temporary housing.

Eligible households: Those (1) which live in Suzu, Wajima, Anamizu, Noto, Nanao, or Shiga, (2) home of which is half destroyed or worse, or (3) which include an elderly person or a person with disabilities, or which are expected not to be able to borrow and pay back funds easily, meaning households which (a) are exempt from resident tax or subject to the per-capita portion only, (b) have had sudden changes in their financial situation, (c) receive a child dependent allowance, (d) include a person who is unemployed or has shut down their business, or (e) have a certain amount of outstanding loans.
